

# INMAN

## Edward and Barbara Inman

*10g-grandparents*

Edward Inman is thought to have been born between 1620 and 1625. He married a woman named Barbara (the widow of Michael Phillips) and had at least two sons, John and Edward. The family lived in Massachusetts for a time and then became among the first settlers of northern Rhode Island, as evidenced by early town records of Providence. Edward was on a list of freemen of Providence in 1655. He made his living as a glover at some point.

## John Inman and Mary Whitman

John Inman was born July 18, 1648 in Braintree, Massachusetts. He soon moved with his family to Rhode Island.

Mary Whitman was born to Valentine and Mary Whitman on November 16, 1652 in Warwick, Rhode Island, the first of many children. Sometime after 1658, the family moved to Providence.

John and Mary were married about 1672 in Providence, Rhode Island. They had at least one child, a daughter named Anne Inman.

John died in 1712 and Mary in 1720
